**SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS
AND OTHER INFORMATION**

Confessions: Every weekday morning after Mass in the Basilica you may ask the Priest for confession. Saturdays from 4-4:45 p.m. in the Basilica.

Marriage: Couples must arrange their wedding ceremony at least 6 months beforehand. Every couple must attend a Pre-Cana meeting. Log on to: www.pre-cana.org for dates and registration.

Sacrament of the Sick: If you know you are going to be hospitalized, consider receiving the Sacrament of Anointing beforehand at any weekday Mass. Ask the priest before Mass in the sacristy.

Communion to the Homebound: Our Eucharistic Ministers are happy to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. To arrange this, please call the Rectory.

Baptism: Parents wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with their children must attend a "Registration and Instruction Session" on the **First Saturday of any month at 11 am in the Basilica Conference Center**. At these sessions it will be necessary for both parents to attend, and to bring a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Necessary registration forms will be completed, the required instruction will take place, and the Baptism will be scheduled. Remember, both Godparents must be Catholic, 16 years old, and must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Godparents may attend these sessions but are not required to do so. Baptisms are celebrated in **English on the third Saturday of each month at noon in the Basilica**. **Once this session is completed, you may schedule the ceremony for any month.**

Those who speak **Spanish** and wish to have a Spanish language ceremony, will have **their registration and instruction session on the First Saturday of each month after the 7:30 pm Mass in the Basilica**. **Spanish Baptisms are celebrated at the Spanish Mass on Saturdays at 7:30 pm in the Basilica.**

It is no longer necessary to come to the Rectory Office to set up a Baptism celebration.

You may call the rectory for *Chinese* or *Italian* Baptisms.

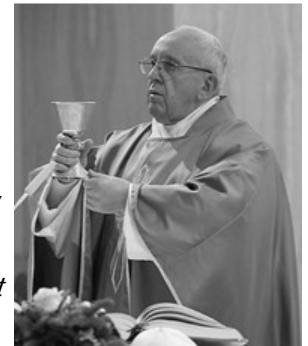

The Holy Father speaks...

The priesthood of Christ takes place in three stages, the Pope said. The first is the redemption: while the priests of the Old Covenant had to offer sacrifices every year, "Christ offered Himself, once for all, for the forgiveness of sins." With this marvel, "He has brought us to the Father... He has re-created the harmony of creation," the Pope noted. The second wonder is what the Lord is doing now – that is, praying for us. "While we pray here, He is praying for us" "for each one of us," Pope Francis emphasized: "now, living, before the Father, He intercedes," so that the faith might not falter. How often, in fact, are priests asked to pray, the Pope said, because "we know that the prayer of the priest has a certain force, especially in the sacrifice of the Mass." The third wonder will be when Christ returns; but this third time will not be in relation to sin, but rather, it will be "to establish the definitive Kingdom," when He will bring all of us to the Father.



PLEASE REMEMBER YOUR PLEDGES

En Sintonía.***Quien es el Obispo?***

Obispo (del latín *episcopus*; en griego vigilante, inspector, supervisor, guardian de las almas. La Iglesia católica, afirma que la sucesión apostólica se mantiene mediante la ordenación de **obispos** de forma ininterrumpida desde los tiempos de los apóstoles. Esto es, los apóstoles ordenaron a obispos, los cuales de forma ininterrumpida han seguido ordenando nuevos obispos hasta hoy. El Obispo, es un sacerdote, que recibe el sacramento del orden sacerdotal en su máximo grado, que es el **episcopado**. Considera al obispo como el miembro de la Iglesia que ha recibido la plenitud del sacerdocio ministerial por el sacramento del orden, sucesor de los apóstoles y pastor encargado del gobierno de una diócesis; en virtud de la colegialidad, comparte con el papa y con los demás obispos la responsabilidad sobre toda la Iglesia católica. por voluntad de Cristo, son designados para el gobierno de una porción de los fieles de la Iglesia, bajo la dirección y autoridad del

Sumo Pontífice, quien puede determinar y restringir sus poderes, pero no eliminarlos.

Tres son las funciones de un obispo: enseñar, santificar y gobernar.

Enseñar: Los obispos tienen el deber de anunciar a todos el Evangelio de Dios, según el mandato que nos dejó Cristo de ir por todo el mundo para predicar el Evangelio. **Santificar:** La Eucaristía es el centro de la vida de la Iglesia particular. Por lo tanto, al obispo le toca ser el administrador de la gracia del sumo sacerdote, en particular en la Eucaristía que él mismo ofrece o cuya oblación asegura por medio de los presbíteros (sacerdotes). **Gobernar:** teniendo como modelo a Cristo, Buen Pastor y no de acuerdo a los criterios humanos del poder. Gobernar buscando ante todo el bien de las Almas a él encomendadas.

Our Lady of Lourdes

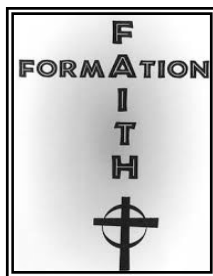

***Our Lady of Lourdes** is a Roman Catholic title of the Blessed Virgin Mary venerated in honor of the Marian apparitions that reportedly occurred in 1858 in the vicinity of Lourdes in France. The first of these is the apparition of 11 February 1858, when 14-year old Bernadette Soubirous told her mother that a "lady" spoke to her in the cave of Massabielle (a mile from the town) while she was gathering firewood with her sister and a friend. Similar apparitions of the alleged "Lady" were reported on seventeen occasions that year, until the climax revelation of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception took place. In 1862, Pope Pius IX authorized Bishop Bertrand-Sévère Laurence to permit the veneration of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Lourdes. On 3 July 1876, the same Pontiff officially granted a Canonical Coronation to the image that used to be in the courtyard of what is now part of the Rosary Basilica. The image of Our Lady of Lourdes has been widely copied and reproduced, often displayed in shrines and homes, often in garden landscapes. Soubirous was later canonized as a Catholic saint.*

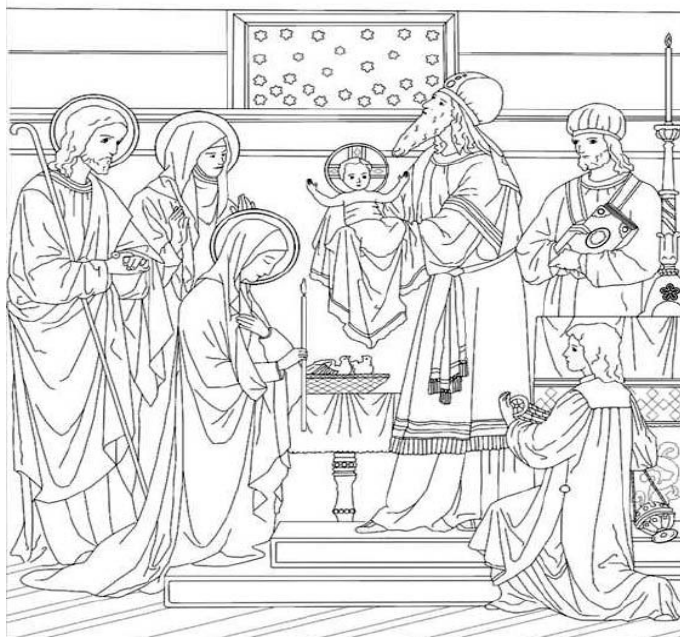

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD



This past Thursday, we celebrated the Presentation as told in Luke 2:22-29. Mary and Joseph were faithful Jews and observed their religious customs. An important custom was for the couple to take their first-born son to the Temple. The baby was taken to the Temple forty days after his birth and was dedicated to God. In addition, if the parents were wealthy, they were to bring a lamb and a young pigeon or a turtle dove to be offered as a sacrifice at the Temple. The custom provided that if the parents were poor, they were to offer two pigeons or two turtle doves for the sacrifice.

When Jesus was forty days old, Mary and Joseph took Him to the Temple in Jerusalem. They were not wealthy, so they took two turtle doves with them to offer as a sacrifice at the Temple. As they arrived at the Temple, Mary and Joseph were met by a very old man named Simeon. He was a holy man and was noted as a very intelligent scholar. Simeon spent much time studying about the prophets of Israel. It was during his studies that he learned of the coming of the Messiah. The Jewish people were waiting for the Messiah to come and deliver Israel from their conquerors. From that time on, Simeon spent his time praying for the Messiah to come. He spent many years in prayer. Finally, while Simeon was praying he heard the voice of God. God promised Simeon that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah.



When Simeon saw Jesus, he took the baby in his arms and blessed the Lord and said:

"Lord, now let Your servant go in peace according to Your promise, because my eyes have seen Your salvation which you have prepared before the face of all peoples, a light to bring revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory to your people Israel."

Also, in the Temple was Anna the Prophetess. She had been a widow for many years. Anna was about eighty-four years old and spent her time in the Temple worshipping, fasting, and praying. When she saw the Christ Child she praised God and spoke of him to all who were awaiting the Messiah.

After Jesus was presented in the Temple, the family returned to Galilee to the town of Nazareth. The Bible tells us that Jesus grew and became strong, and was filled with wisdom.

Let us pray... **ALMIGHTY EVER-LIVING GOD, WE HUMBLY IMPLORE YOUR MAJESTY THAT, JUST AS YOUR ONLY BEGOTTEN SON WAS PRESENTED ON THIS DAY IN THE TEMPLE IN THE SUBSTANCE OF OUR FLESH, SO, BY YOUR GRACE, WE MAY BE PRESENTED TO YOU WITH MINDS MADE PURE. THROUGH OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, YOUR SON, WHO LIVES AND REIGNS WITH YOU IN THE UNITY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT, ONE GOD, FOR EVER AND EVER.**
