**SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS  
AND OTHER INFORMATION**

**Confessions:** Every weekday morning after Mass in the Basilica you may ask the Priest for confession. Saturdays from 4-4:45 p.m. in the Basilica.

**Marriage:** Couples must arrange their wedding ceremony at least 6 months beforehand. Every couple must attend a Pre-Cana meeting. Log on to: [www.pre-cana.org](http://www.pre-cana.org) for dates and registration.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** If you know you are going to be hospitalized, consider receiving the Sacrament of Anointing beforehand at any weekday Mass. Ask the priest before Mass in the sacristy.

**Communion to the Homebound:** Our Eucharistic Ministers are happy to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. To arrange this, please call the Rectory.

**Baptism:** Parents wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with their children must attend a "Registration and Instruction Session" on the **First Saturday of any month at 11 am in the Basilica Conference Center**. At these sessions it will be necessary for both parents to attend, and to bring a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Necessary registration forms will be completed, the required instruction will take place, and the Baptism will be scheduled. Remember, both Godparents must be Catholic, 16 years old, and must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Godparents may attend these sessions but are not required to do so. Baptisms are celebrated in **English on the third Saturday of each month at noon in the Basilica**. **Once this session is completed, you may schedule the ceremony for any month.**

Those who speak **Spanish** and wish to have a Spanish language ceremony, will have their registration and instruction session on the **First Saturday of each month after the 7:30 pm Mass in the Basilica**. **Spanish Baptisms are celebrated at the Spanish Mass on Saturdays at 7:30 pm in the Basilica.**

**It is no longer necessary to come to the Rectory Office to set up a Baptism celebration.**

You may call the rectory for *Chinese* or *Italian* Baptisms.

*From the Pastor's Desk...***LENT is right around the corner. Are you ready?**

On March 1st (Ash Wednesday) we begin the holy season of Lent. It is a time of serious reflection, prayer, fasting, charity, and sacrifice. Contrary to popular belief it is a time of JOY not sadness, because we are getting ready for the great feast of Easter. We do our “penances” with joy because we know that they are changing us and making us better Christians.

Traditionally, people would “give up something” in Lent as a sacrifice. However, the things which were often given up did nothing to make us stronger in our commitment to Christ. No chocolate, no ice cream, no drinking, etc. were all “NO THINGS”. Along with these there need to be “YES THINGS”.

Here are some suggestions of what things reflect the true meaning and practice of Lent:

- **PRAY MORE**—You don’t have to be in church to pray. The Our Father or Hail Mary can be recited in the car, in the subway, while walking, etc. But committing your self to praying these prayers EACH DAY will give you even a few minutes of time with your mind on God.
- **CONFESSION**—we have 40 days in Lent. A priest can hear a confession anywhere, in any place, at any time. How long can you really go on without asking for God’s forgiveness in the Sacrament of Penance or asking for His help with sins that are difficult to conquer. Confession is not for saints. It is for people who are struggling. Jesus said: “...those who say they have no sin are liars”.
- **MEDITATION**—this is simply the act of putting yourself in a quiet place and being quiet. Sooner or later the Holy Spirit will help you to see God’s presence in your life. We have a beautiful opportunity for quiet meditation every FRIDAY from 9am to 7pm in St. Joseph Chapel. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar and people visit to pray in silence. It is beautiful and peaceful. Why not commit yourself to a 15 minute visit every Friday in Lent.
- **ACTS OF CHARITY AND KINDNESS**—We have 40 days. Commit yourself to perform 40 acts of charity, i.e., 40 phone calls to people you know could use some friendship; write a letter to some soldiers on the battlefield (we will mail them for you); write a supportive letter to a seminary student offering him prayers (we will mail them); have your children do these with you so they can learn.
- **THE CROSS**—Do you have a crucifix in your house? If not, buy a simple one and put it where it can be seen easily. (A crucifix is a plain cross with the figure of the body of Christ affixed to it.) In Lent we reflect on Christ’s suffering for our salvation.
- **HELP THE POOR**—learn about them. Go to *Catholic Relief Services* online and see where the Catholic Church is working. Donate to them. Pray for them. Sacrifice for them. Get personally involved. In December two of our parishioners (Nick and Mike Fiorito) decided to collect blankets for the homeless and bring them to the people. It was a beautiful idea and it answered many needs. St. Francis said “...it is in giving the WE receive”. Just ask Nick or Mike if that is true! The powerful oceans are made up of many single rain drops.

We will continue to talk about Lent in the coming weeks. We really want it to mean something for each of you and your children. Let us know what you are doing. Your ideas can be helpful and encouraging to others.

March 4th is First Saturday.

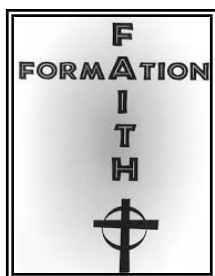

### Confirmation Service Hours

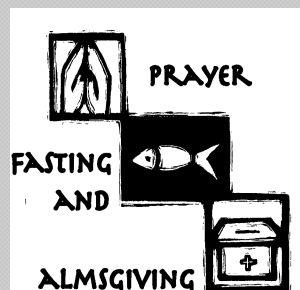
- Every Sunday after 12:00 pm Mass Confirmandi are asked to help straighten out rooms in the Basilica's Conference Center.
