**SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS  
AND OTHER INFORMATION**

**Confessions:** Every weekday morning after Mass in the Basilica you may ask the Priest for confession. Saturdays from 4-4:45 p.m. in the Basilica.

**Marriage:** Couples must arrange their wedding ceremony at least 6 months beforehand. Every couple must attend a Pre-Cana meeting. Log on to: [www.pre-cana.org](http://www.pre-cana.org) for dates and registration.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** If you know you are going to be hospitalized, consider receiving the Sacrament of Anointing beforehand at any weekday Mass. Ask the priest before Mass in the sacristy.

**Communion to the Homebound:** Our Eucharistic Ministers are happy to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. To arrange this, please call the Rectory.

**Baptism:** Parents wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with their children must attend a "Registration and Instruction Session" on the **First Saturday of any month at 11 am in the Basilica Conference Center**. At these sessions it will be necessary for both parents to attend, and to bring a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Necessary registration forms will be completed, the required instruction will take place, and the Baptism will be scheduled. Remember, both Godparents must be Catholic, 16 years old, and must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Godparents may attend these sessions but are not required to do so. Baptisms are celebrated in **English on the third Saturday of each month at noon in the Basilica**. **Once this session is completed, you may schedule the ceremony for any month.**

Those who speak **Spanish** and wish to have a Spanish language ceremony, will have **their registration and instruction session on the First Saturday of each month after the 7:30 pm Mass in the Basilica**. **Spanish Baptisms are celebrated at the Spanish Mass on Saturdays at 7:30 pm in the Basilica.**

**It is no longer necessary to come to the Rectory Office to set up a Baptism celebration.**

You may call the rectory for *Chinese* or *Italian* Baptisms.

## ***From the Pastor's Desk.....***

### **TIME TALENT AND TREASURE**

These are the three "T" s which every Pastor needs and asks for from his parishioners.

**TIME** includes your availability and presence at parish events and religious functions. It is interesting to notice that when we try to offer opportunities for your spiritual growth of the growth of the faith in your family, the attendance and participation is very low. Some say "...nights are no good" others say "...weekends are too busy". Daytime is work time. etc. So when can we schedule things? We also try to choose things that might be helpful like: Bible Study, Parenting discussions, Bereavement groups, etc. and we are open to many suggestions: BUT nobody comes!!

The **WHOLE** life of our parish community is important to us. Marriages need strengthening, guidance is needed on raising kids in this day and age, people need jobs and other help. The Parish is the real home of every family. It is not a "gas station" where you pull up, fill the tank on Sundays and go home. Learning and preserving our Catholic faith and Catholic identity is a crucial need in every Catholic family. Ask yourself how much do you really know and understand about our religion? If it's not a lot, then your children know less than you!!

**TALENT.** Many people have great talents which can be shared with others for the benefit of all. Think of our beautiful choir. None are professionals, but the simple ability to carry a tune, and a willingness to make our liturgies more prayerful, caused them to join the choir. Others are good at "doing things". Painting, carpentry, teaching, art, computer knowledge, sports, money management, secretarial work, etc. Do you realize how many more things we could get done if you only volunteered your **TIME** and **TALENT**?

**TREASURE.** This involves your continued generosity to the Parish. Everyone of us has financial obligations that must be met. When the Parish and the Diocese ask for contributions, it is not because we believe that you have money hidden under your bed. It is because we can only do the things we need to do with extra help.

The maintenance of the Parish and Diocesan programs depend heavily on the extra contributions of the faithful.

It is now time for us to participate in the **ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL**. This is an attempt by the Diocese to help us share in funds that are raised first for Diocesan needs, and then completely for the Parish. 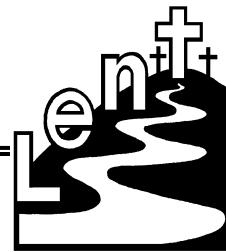

**En Sintonía.*****El Viacrucis ó via del Calvario.***

Vía crucis (en latín: «camino de la cruz») se refiere a las diferentes etapas o momentos vividos por Jesús desde el momento en que fue aprehendido hasta su crucifixión y sepultura. La expresión se usa también comúnmente para expresar todo tipo de dificultades que se presentan en la vida cuando se quieren alcanzar ciertos objetivos. Vía crucis también conocido como "Estaciones de la Cruz" y Vía Dolorosa. Se trata de un acto de piedad, un camino de oración que busca con la meditación de la pasión y muerte de Jesucristo en su camino al Calvario. El camino se representa con una serie de catorce imágenes de la Pasión, denominadas *estaciones*, correspondientes a incidentes particulares que, según la tradición cristiana, Jesús sufrió por la salvación de la humanidad basados en los relatos evangélicos y la tradición. También se llama *Viacrucis* al recorrido

de cruces que señalan un camino o una ruta donde se puede realizar este ejercicio piadoso. La costumbre es hacer un recorrido grupal que puede tener lugar dentro del templo o por las calles, deteniéndose en cada estación y haciendo una oración en cada una, una lectura de algún pasaje del evangelio y también un canto.

Cómo rezar el Santo Vía Crucis El Vía Crucis, normalmente, se reza de pie, y por momentos de rodillas; si se hace en casa, se puede estar caminando, deteniéndose en cada estación, para recordar el camino de Jesús al Calvario, es por eso que las imágenes de la representación del Vía Crucis están en la pared, alrededor del templo. Antes de comenzar las 14 estaciones que componen el Vía crucis, se suelen rezar la Señal de la Santa Cruz y el Acto de Contrición. Para cada estación: 1. Se anuncia la estación 2. Se dice: (V): ¡Te adoramos, Cristo, y te bendecimos! (R): Porque por tu Santa Cruz redimiste al mundo. 3. Se hace la lectura correspondiente. 4. Se deja un breve silencio. 5. Se puede rezar un Padrenuestro, Avemaría y Gloria. 6. Se dice: (V): ¡Señor, pequé (R) : Tened piedad y misericordia de mí. Para terminar se puede rezar una oración o plegaria final y la Bendición.

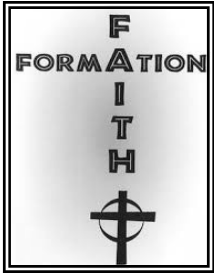
