**SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS  
AND OTHER INFORMATION**

**Confessions:** Every weekday morning after Mass in the Basilica you may ask the Priest for confession. Saturdays from 4-4:45 p.m. in the Basilica.

**Marriage:** Couples must arrange their wedding ceremony at least 6 months beforehand. Every couple must attend a Pre-Cana meeting. Log on to: [www.pre-cana.org](http://www.pre-cana.org) for dates and registration.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** If you know you are going to be hospitalized, consider receiving the Sacrament of Anointing beforehand at any weekday Mass. Ask the priest before Mass in the sacristy.

**Communion to the Homebound:** Our Eucharistic Ministers are happy to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. To arrange this, please call the Rectory.

**Baptism:** Parents wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with their children must attend a "Registration and Instruction Session" on the **First Saturday of any month at 11 am in the Basilica Conference Center**. At these sessions it will be necessary for both parents to attend, and to bring a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Necessary registration forms will be completed, the required instruction will take place, and the Baptism will be scheduled. Remember, both Godparents must be Catholic, 16 years old, and must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Godparents may attend these sessions but are not required to do so. Baptisms are celebrated in **English on the third Saturday of each month at noon in the Basilica**. **Once this session is completed, you may schedule the ceremony for any month.**

Those who speak **Spanish** and wish to have a Spanish language ceremony, will have **their registration and instruction session on the First Saturday of each month after the 7:30 pm Mass in the Basilica**. **Spanish Baptisms are celebrated at the Spanish Mass on Saturdays at 7:30 pm in the Basilica.**

**It is no longer necessary to come to the Rectory Office to set up a Baptism celebration.**

You may call the rectory for *Chinese* or *Italian* Baptisms.

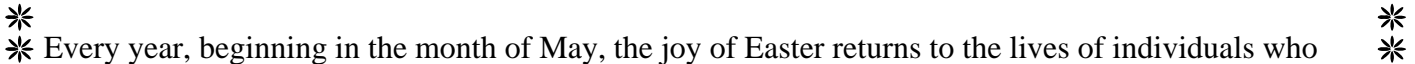

**SPRINGTIME IS SACRAMENT TIME!**



Every year, beginning in the month of May, the joy of Easter returns to the lives of individuals who have been preparing and waiting for that special moment which occurs when Our Lord Jesus Christ touches these individuals in a most special and indelible way.

On May 20th, 76 of our children will be receiving their First Holy Communion. These children and their parents have been preparing for this day for the past few years and now it is here. Even though sometimes that specialness of Communion Day is clouded by the "trappings" we have added to the experience over the years, however, it still remains the beginning of a lifetime of the Lord feeding His children with His precious Body and Blood in the **Holy Eucharist**. 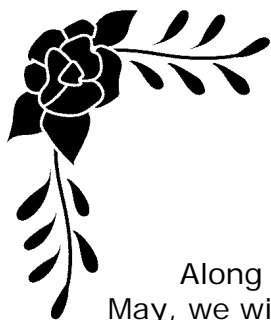
Pray for these two men whose lives will be totally changed by the Holy Spirit this month through the Sacrament of **Holy Orders**.

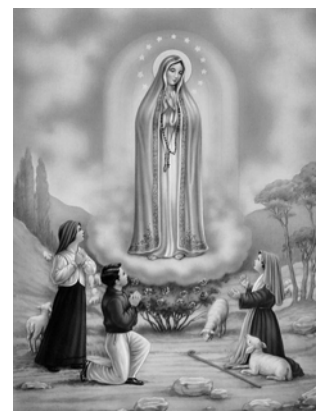

**En Sintonía.****Jesús es el Buen Pastor**

Moisés y David, antes de ser llamados a convertirse en jefes y pastores del pueblo de Dios, habían sido efectivamente pastores de muchos rebaños por épocas. En las pruebas del tiempo del exilio, ante el fracaso de los pastores de Israel, es decir, de los líderes políticos y religiosos, Ezequiel había trazado la imagen de Dios mismo como Pastor de su pueblo. Dios dice a través del profeta: Como un pastor vela por su rebaño, así velaré yo por mis ovejas. Las reuniré de todos los lugares donde se habían dispersado en el día de nubes y Ahora Jesús anuncia que ese momento ha llegado: él mismo es el buen Pastor en quien Dios mismo vela por su criatura, el hombre, reuniendo a los seres humanos y conduciéndolos al verdadero pasto. San Pedro, a quien el Señor resucitado había confiado la misión de apacentar a sus ovejas, de convertirse en pastor con él y por él, llama a Jesús el el Pastor supremo y con esto quiere decir que sólo se puede ser pastor del rebaño de Jesucristo por medio de él y en la

más íntima comunión con él. Precisamente esto es lo que se expresa en el sacramento de la Ordenación: el sacerdote, mediante el sacramento, es insertado totalmente en Cristo para que, partiendo de él y actuando con vistas a él, realice en comunión con él el servicio del único Pastor, Jesús, en el que Dios como hombre quiere ser nuestro Pastor. El Señor nos sorprende diciendo: Yo soy la puerta. En el servicio de pastor hay que entrar a través de él. Jesús pone de relieve con gran claridad esta condición de fondo, afirmando: "El que sube por otro lado, ese es un ladrón y un salteador". Esta palabra "sube" evoca la imagen de alguien que trepa al recinto para llegar, saltando, a donde legítimamente no podría llegar. Pero el único camino para subir legítimamente hacia el ministerio de pastor es la cruz. Esta es la verdadera subida, esta es la verdadera puerta. No desear llegar a ser alguien, sino, por el contrario, ser para los demás, para Cristo, y así, mediante él y con él, ser para los hombres que él busca, que él quiere conducir por el camino de la vida. Se entra en el sacerdocio a través del sacramento; y esto significa precisamente: a través de la entrega a Cristo, para que él disponga decada uno. Entrar por la puerta, que es Cristo, quiere decir conocerlo y amarlo cada vez más, para que nuestra voluntad se una a la suya y nuestro actuar llegue a ser uno con su actuar. El pastor da su vida por las ovejas. El misterio de la cruz está en el centro del servicio de Jesús como pastor: primero es el gran servicio que él nos presta a todos nosotros. Se entrega a sí mismo, y no sólo en un pasado lejano. Sólo quien da su vida la encuentra. En segundo lugar el Señor nos dice: Conozco mis ovejas y las mías me conocen a mí, igual que el Padre me conoce y yo conozco al Padre.

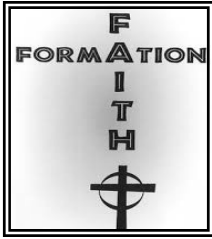

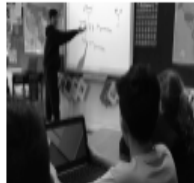
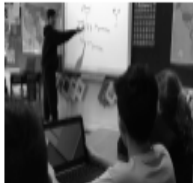
