**SACRAMENTAL CELEBRATIONS
AND OTHER INFORMATION**

Confessions: Every weekday morning after Mass in the Basilica you may ask the Priest for confession. Saturdays from 4-4:45 p.m. in the Basilica.

Marriage: Couples must arrange their wedding ceremony at least 6 months beforehand. Every couple must attend a Pre-Cana meeting. Log on to: www.pre-cana.org for dates and registration.

Sacrament of the Sick: If you know you are going to be hospitalized, consider receiving the Sacrament of Anointing beforehand at any weekday Mass. Ask the priest before Mass in the sacristy.

Communion to the Homebound: Our Eucharistic Ministers are happy to bring Holy Communion to the homebound. To arrange this, please call the Rectory.

Baptism: Parents wishing to celebrate the Sacrament of Baptism with their children must attend a "Registration and Instruction Session" on the **First Saturday of any month at 11 am in the Basilica Conference Center.** At these sessions it will be necessary for both parents to attend, and to bring a copy of the baby's birth certificate. Necessary registration forms will be completed, the required instruction will take place, and the Baptism will be scheduled. Remember, both Godparents must be Catholic, 16 years old, and must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. Godparents may attend these sessions but are not required to do so. Baptisms are celebrated in **English on the third Saturday of each month at noon in the Basilica.** **Once this session is completed, you may schedule the ceremony for any month.**

Those who speak **Spanish** and wish to have a Spanish language ceremony, will have **their registration and instruction session on the First Saturday of each month after the 7:30 pm Mass in the Basilica. Spanish Baptisms are celebrated at the Spanish Mass on Saturdays at 7:30 pm in the Basilica.**

It is no longer necessary to come to the Rectory Office to set up a Baptism celebration.

You may call the rectory for *Chinese* or *Italian* Baptisms.

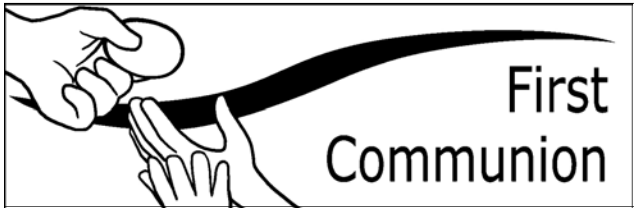

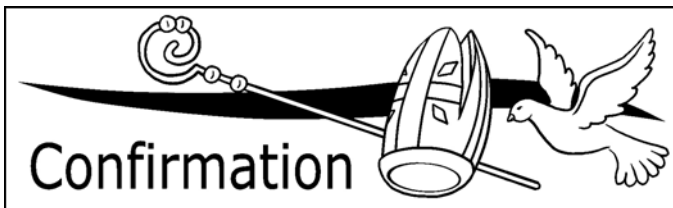

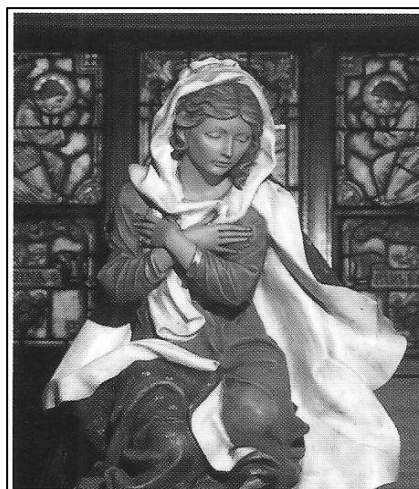

En Sintonía.***Jesus es la Verdad el Camino y la Vida.***

En la quinta semana de Pascua Jesús se presenta en el Evangelio como la Verdad, la Via y la Vida y nos llama al valor del compromiso de la fe católica. La fe es el gran don divino que Jesucristo ha hecho a la Iglesia. Dice san Pablo que la fe surge de la proclamación, y la proclamación se verifica mediante la palabra de Cristo. Los Apostoles que convivieron con Jesús durante vario tiempo, deben dar ahora un paso para descubrir otra manera de convivir con Jesús resucitado y presente, pero invisible. leemos el primero de estos discursos. Al ir

Jesús donde el Padre, nos abre el camino a nuestra Casa, la cual no se sitúa muy arriba de nosotros, sino en Dios. Yo soy el camino, dice Jesús, en mí verán al Padre. Cristo nos hace entrar a la familia divina. Dios está siempre con nosotros. la lectura del evangelio de S. Juan, nos prepara para celebrar la venida del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés. Los primeros cristianos creían que el regreso de Jesús, la *Parusía*, osea la segunda venida era inminente. Esta creencia estaba basada en la promesa de Jesús de volver a ellos. Juan, que escribe su Evangelio en los años 90s, lo explica de un modo diferente: Cristo, quien es el camino, la verdad, y la vida, regresará a ellos a través del Espíritu Santo. Para Juan, ésta es la *Parusía osea la segunda venida* que cuenta. Debido a esta certeza de que Cristo está con ellos, los discípulos no necesitan preocuparse o afanarse por nada. Jesús insiste en la necesidad de la fe asegurándoles que se va para prepararles un lugar y que regresará por ellos. Jesús es el camino porque es la verdad, es decir, la revelación personal del Padre a los hombres y, al mismo tiempo, es el proyecto de vida para el mundo de parte de Dios tal como se ha manifestado en Jesús de Nazaret. Por eso, al discípulo de Jesús. Todo el que pertenece a la verdad escucha mi voz. Es necesario permanecer en relación personal con Jesús para ser de la verdad y obrar la verdad.

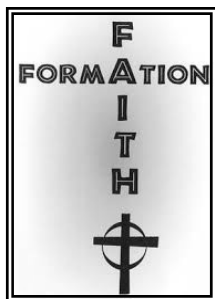

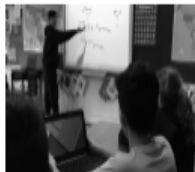

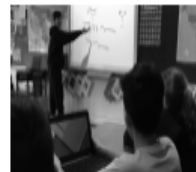
